These fee tables summarize the fees for students admitted to the University of Toronto Scarborough (UTSC) including those who transferred from either the Faculty of Arts & Science (FAS) or University of Toronto Mississauga (UTM). The fee tables summarize the following fees:

<u>Program</u>: Flat rate amount charged to all students in a specific program; there may be a full-time and/or part-time rate.

<u>Course</u>: Fees are assessed on a course by course basis. When a course is added, the course fee is charged immediately, regardless of when the course begins. When a course is cancelled, the course fee is reversed in accordance with the refund schedule applicable to the student's program.

<u>Minimum Charge</u>: A minimum charge of \$338.00 will be charged to students who cancel their registration in the Fall or Winter semester (degree or non-degree studies) on or after the published date for the first day of classes for the semester but before the 100% <u>refund deadline</u>.

<u>Incidental</u>: Mandatory fees for university and student society services. This fee schedule displays Fall incidental fee total as of the beginning of the Fall-Winter billing period. Students can view Winter incidental fees on ACORN invoice.

**System Access**: \$60.50 fee for the access to the Student Web Service – ACORN.

<u>Ancillary</u>: Fees charged for enrolment in specific courses or for individual circumstances. These fees are displayed in the Tuition Charges section of the ACORN online invoice.

<u>University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP)</u>: UHIP is compulsory for all international students as well as recent permanent residents and returning Canadian citizens who are in their 3 month OHIP wait period. International students who have been exempted from UHIP must request this exemption every year at the <u>UTSC International Student Centre</u>.

### **Fees Invoice and Payment**

For academic purposes, University of Toronto Scarborough operates on a trimester system:

- 1. Summer semester (May to August)
- 2. Fall semester (September to December)
- 3. Winter semester (January to April)

However, student fees are invoiced for two sessions, namely:

- 1. Fall/Winter session (September to April): The Fall/Winter session invoice summarizes both the Fall and Winter semester fees.
- 2. Summer session (May to August): The Summer session invoice summarizes the Summer semester fees.

All fees and charges posted to the ACORN invoice are payable when billed. Students are responsible for planning sufficient time for payments to reach the University's bank account and to be recorded in the student's ACORN account by the payment due date. The transfer of funds from major Canadian financial institutions normally takes three to five business days, however the transfer from Canadian credit unions and financial institutions from outside Canada can take much longer.

Paper invoices are not routinely mailed. Students are expected to monitor their account on <u>ACORN</u>. Failure to check does not constitute non-receipt of an invoice and does not exempt students from meeting their financial obligations.

### **Service Charges**

Any outstanding account balance is subject to a monthly service charge of 1.5% compounded (19.56% per annum) as per the fee payment and monthly service charge billing schedules that can be viewed at <a href="https://www.fees.utoronto.ca">www.fees.utoronto.ca</a> or by clicking on the **Guide to Reading your Invoice and Invoice FAQs link** on the online invoice in ACORN.

- 6. The normal length of a Degree program is four years for students who do not take a Co-op Year. Students who exceed the normal length of their program will be charged the same tuition as students in the final year of the program.

### **Deregulated Tuition Programs**

Tables 2, 3 and 4 refer to deregulated fees charged for students pursuing Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) degrees, Computer Science Programs (Specialist or Major) and Double Degree Programs: Management & Finance (BBA) & Statistics — Quantitative Finance (HBSc). The following notes apply to each group:

- 1. Normal entry point for these programs is the semester after a student has earned 4.0 credits or more; this includes transfer credits.
- 2. If a student enters these programs after having earned more than 4.0 credits (including transfer credits), this is a late entry point and will result in Program Fees retroactively charged for all courses back to the point at which the student has earned at least 4.0 credits.
- 3. No matter how many courses you intend to enroll in eventually, all students will INITIALLY be charged the Program Fee. Students who intend to enrol in a course load less than 2.0 credits can request a change to Per-Course fees billing on <u>eService</u> between July 14th and September 15th for F & Y courses, and up to January 18th for S courses. See Note 4.
- 4. Students who are enrolled in a course load of 2.0 or more credits in each semester will be charged a Program Fee. For fee calculation purposes, the Fall semester course load is determined with the following formula: F+Y courses as of September 15th.
  - a. The F course load count determined on September 15th will be fixed for the Fall semester on September 15th even if the student cancels the F courses after September 15th
  - b. The Y course load count determined on September 15th will be fixed for the Fall and Winter semesters even if the student cancels the Y courses after September 15th.
  - c. The S course load count determined on January 18th will be fixed for the Winter semester even if the student cancels the S courses after January 18th. The Winter semester course load is determined with the following formula:

    Y courses (as of September 15th) and S courses as of January 18th.
- 5. Students with a documented permanent disability who are required to take a reduced course load as a learning accommodation will be billed Per-Course fees for the course load up to a maximum of 2.0 credits per semester. Refer to table 2C/3C/4C (depending on your area of study) for tuition fees for course load of 1.5 and 2.0 credits.
- 6. These fee schedules display the Fall incidental fee total as of the beginning of the Fall-Winter billing period. Students can view Winter incidental fees on ACORN invoice
- 7. There may be additional ancillary fees charged for enrolment in specific courses or for individual circumstances. Co-op and Centennial Joint programs have additional program fees (see Table 5A or 5B). Check the online invoice in ACORN.
